finished measurements

70 (from long tip to long tip) x 20"

yarn

Julie Asselin Merletto

(75% merino, 15% cashmere, 10% silk;

740 m / 800 y)

1 skein

needles and notions

4 mm (US 6) 24" circular knitting needles –
or size needed to obtain gauge

gauge

27 sts and 30 rows in 4" / 10cm

Stockinette stitch

This shawl is a parallelogram with one end sloping more than the other. The shawl begins with stockinette and short rows, which creates a gentle slope, half way through the pattern switches to reverse stockinette with short row shaping at the end creating a steeper slope.



pattern

Set-Up

Cast on **135** sts.

Purl WS row.

Begin Short Row Section

Knit 4, W&T. Purl to end.

Knit 4 sts beyond wrapped stitch, picking up wrap as you go, W&T.

Purl back.

Continue in this manner until there are no stitches left (no W&T) at the end.

Purl across whole row.

Stockinette Section

Work in stockinette until almost half of the yarn is used.

Reverse Stockinette Section

Switch to reverse stockinette meaning you will purl on the knit side and knit on the purl side, and knit until you have approximately 16 grams left.

Begin your Short Rows:

Knit until the last 3 sts W&T

Purl back

Knit to 2 sts before the last W&T, W&T

Purl back.

Repeat these last 2 rows until you have completed all the shorts rows.

(Note: I used 14 grams for the short row section)

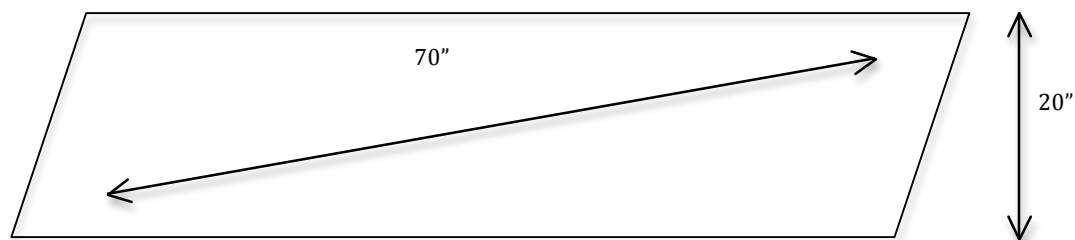
Knit 1 row picking up your wraps

Bind-off purlwise.

standard abbreviations

WS: wrong side

Wrap and Turn (W&T) on a knit side: Work to place specified in pattern, bring yarn to front of work between your needles, slip next stitch from left needle to right needle, then bring the yarn to the back again between the two needles. Slip the previously slipped stitch back to the left needle, turn your work. Now you are ready to purl back.
